



Graduate Gardeners win 4th Gold Medal !

Graduate Gardeners 'Garden for Life' has won a record 4th Gold Medal at the Malvern Spring Gardening Show, and The Best in Show award for the third year running.

TV presenter, Joe Swift said that it was the "Standout garden of the Show" and that the planting flowed beautifully from the building to wildflower lawn. The judges did not want to leave the garden and said that while they had seen many themed gardens this was a "Real garden to live in and one that they would want for themselves"

The key members of the team, Designer, Stuart Gibbs, Foreman, Richard Banyard and joinery expert, Chris Fry, have over 100 years of service for the Company between them, and are thrilled to be celebrating with a Fourth RHS Gold Medal.

Shane Nash, Adam Thomas and Tom Humphries from Bisley complete the team.

The garden features a large 'A Framed' building which is geared for multi-purpose use, with lots of 'Green' initiatives on display, including a Solar powered water feature and Rainwater Harvesting supplied by 'The Greenshop' also in Bisley. There is also a purple Eco Beehive and a live Wormery on display, and a small vegetable and fruit garden.

The garden is designed for family use, with the eaves of the 'A Frame' building being utilised as a greenhouse and bin store. There is an adult entertaining area on the ground floor which runs out onto a Eucalyptus Deck where a rope swing hangs invitingly from the rafters. Children can scurry up a ladder, built into the main frame, to their secret hideaway in the attic.
